1. Our vision and mission

 - To nurture a personal relationship with God through daily prayer and liturgy.
 - To develop a strong sense of Catholic social teaching and mission through practical action and outreach.

4. Sacramental preparation and special events

- **Sacramental programmes:**

- **Year 3: Sacramental Programme delivered both in church and school. Parish Priest and Chair of Governors support children on their journey along with staff in school**
- **School Masses:**
 - **Whole-school Masses to mark the start and end of the school year.**
 - **Advent, Ash Wednesday, Easter**
- **Opportunities for Reconciliation:**
 - **In church during Sacramental Programme**
- **Community outreach:**
 - Harvest festival collection for the local food bank (Bolton Urban Outreach)
 - Supporting the diocesan Caritas charity through fundraising
 - Children in Need, Red Nose Day, Macmillan coffee morning

5. Pupil leadership and engagement

- **GIFT team:** An enthusiastic team of older pupils who support and lead aspects of the school's Catholic life.
- **Prayer buddies:** Older pupils supporting younger children during liturgy and prayer sessions.
- **Fundraising and mission:** House Captains identify and organise charitable projects.

6. Monitoring and evaluation

- **Review:** The APOP is a working document, reviewed termly by the Religious Education Subject Leads and governors.
- Senior Leaders will ensure all staff receive an annual PLD-focused training session. This includes induction for new staff on the structure and purpose of the four-part liturgy (Gather, Word, Response, Mission), making them accountable for the quality of daily classroom Prayer and Liturgy.
- Prayer and Liturgy leads will maintain a record of staff formation, ensuring all staff receive an annual PLD-focused training session. This includes induction for new staff on the structure and purpose of the four-part liturgy (Gather, Word, Response, Mission), making them accountable for the quality of daily classroom Prayer and Liturgy.
- **Feedback:** The school will seek feedback on the quality of provision from pupils, staff, and parents.

Early Years (Foundation Unit)

The focus for Early Years is on creating a sense of God's unconditional love and establishing a foundation of simple prayer.

- **Worship and prayer:**
 - Learn the Sign of the Cross through song and actions.
 - Say the school prayers at the beginning and the end of the day
 - Begin to say the Our Father and Hail Mary prayers
 - Children to choose items for the 'Gather' for Prayer and Liturgy sessions
- **Ministry and mission:**
 - Focus on themes of gratitude, such as creating a "Thankful Tree" in the classroom.
 - Engage in simple acts of kindness, such as making and sending Christmas and Easter cards to our local care home.
- **Theological understanding:**
 - Explore creation and God's world using sensory-rich activities like exploring the school garden.
 - Tell Bible stories in an age-appropriate way, using props and expressive voices.

Key Stage 1 (Years 1-2)

Building on the Early Years foundation, KS1 ministry involves simple participation in liturgical life and a developing sense of belonging to God's family.

- **Worship and prayer:**
 - Introduce more formal prayers, such as the "Glory Be".
 - Children to choose the gather objects, song and begin to read the Gospel during Prayer and Liturgy
 - Experience short, reflective meditation sessions, like guided meditation.
- **Ministry and mission:**
 - Engage in simple charitable actions, such as designing and sending cards to key workers in the local community.
 - Participate in school-wide charity events like a Harvest Festival collection for a local food bank.
- **Theological understanding:**
 - Teach about the importance of forgiveness and making good choices through stories like the Prodigal Son.

- Begin to learn about the liturgical year and the meaning of different seasons.

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3-4)

At this stage, ministry expands to include sacramental preparation, deeper reflection, and more active roles in worship.

- **Worship and prayer:**

- Prepare for the sacraments of Holy Communion (Year 3)
- Introduce children to the Rosary, and teach how to use it with different mysteries.
- Involve pupils in planning and leading class Prayer and Liturgy

- **Ministry and mission:**

- Take on responsibility for caring for the class pet, linking it to the stewardship of creation.
- Participate in charitable competitions, like an Easter Hamper or Easter Egg Colouring competition, for a good cause.

- **Theological understanding:**

- Explore the structure of the Bible and key stories from both the Old and New Testaments.

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5-6)

By the end of primary school, children take on significant leadership roles, becoming advocates for their faith and the wider community.

- **Worship and prayer:**

- Establish a formal Pupil GIFT Team through an application and commissioning process.
- Have GIFT team members help deliver class and school-wide liturgy and worship.
- Engage in deeper prayer through reflective exercises and the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.

- **Ministry and mission:**

- Welcome and buddy up with new Early Years children to build a cohesive school community.
- Organise and lead fundraising events, such as toy sales or coffee mornings for charities like CAFOD.

- Become "courageous advocates" for social justice, raising awareness of local and global issues.
- **Theological understanding:**
 - Study different stories of Creation, thinking about what it means to be made in God's image.
 - Explore the Beatitudes and how they challenge people to live more like Jesus.

LEADING PRAYER & LITURGY

Phase 1: Early Years (Foundation Unit)

In the Early Years, the focus is on introducing the foundational concepts and rituals of collective worship.

- **Skill focus:** Listening, simple responses, recognition of sacred objects.
- **Activities:**
 - **Gather:** Learn and consistently use the Sign of the Cross. Help set up the focal point with liturgical cloth, a Bible, and a candle.

- **Word:** Listen to simple Bible stories, often using props or visual aids.
- **Response:** Learn simple, repetitive prayers like "Thank you, God". Participate in sung prayer through simple hymns with actions.
- **Mission:** Practice making kind choices and sharing with others as a response to God's love.

Phase 2: Key Stage 1 (Years 1–2)

Children at this stage begin to take on more active roles within a small group setting.

- **Skill focus:** Speaking simple prayers, choosing music, and understanding the four-part structure.
- **Activities:**
 - **Gather:** Work in small groups to select reflective music to play. Practice simple greeting responses like "The Lord be with you".
 - **Word:** Choose a Bible reading from a teacher-provided list and help tell the story using actions.
 - **Response:** Compose and lead short, simple class prayers with adult support. Select hymns that link to the worship theme.
 - **Mission:** Draw or write a simple promise related to the worship's message to display on the class prayer table.

Phase 3: Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3–4)

Children start independently planning sections of collective worship, moving from classroom-based to whole-school roles.

- **Skill focus:** Planning, reading with expression, and using liturgical colours and symbols.
- **Activities:**
 - **Gather:** Small groups of pupils take full responsibility for setting up the worship area, including choosing the correct liturgical colour and relevant artefacts.
 - **Word:** Independently choose a suitable scripture passage and rehearse reading it aloud to the class.
 - **Response:** Plan and lead prayer, guided reflection, or a simple drama to respond to the Word.
 - **Mission:** Create a visual response or artwork to symbolise the mission, such as a display for a charity.
 - **Evaluation:** Use a feedback proforma to reflect on their own collective worship.

Phase 4: Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5–6)

Children at this stage can take on significant leadership and mentoring roles, planning and delivering high-quality collective worship with minimal adult support.

- **Skill focus:** Advanced planning, public speaking, mentoring, and whole-school leadership.

- **Activities:**

- **Leadership roles:** Form a GIFT team. This team can help plan and deliver whole-school worship.
- **Whole-school worship:** Plan and lead the whole-school assembly on a rotating basis during Wednesdays' assemblies, including selecting hymns, readings, and music.
- **Cross-phase mentoring:** Older children prepare and lead collective worship for younger classes, supporting them in their own faith journeys.
- **Evaluation:** Use a shared school evaluation tool to systematically review collective worship, providing feedback to staff and governors.
- **Mission:** Independently research and organise social justice activities, linking them back to the school's mission.
